GATHERING PLACE

Tumble Creek at Suncadia beckons second homeowners to the Pacific Northwest with the unveiling of its new Great House.

Homeowners can choose from two new real estate options: Tumble Creek Cabins—a collection of four ready-to-build plans with various finish options—and Paintbrush Lakes, the newest offering of 105 homesites. But when it's time to leave the comforts of home, equally enticing options await. In addition to The Hill House—a state-of-the-art fitness and aquatic

center—and The Golf House, The Great House is the newest extension of home for Tumble Creek owners. “The Great House, first and foremost, was designed to capture the amazing signature mountain views to the west, as well as the five holes of core golf that lie out under the mountain view,” Jeffries says. “The Great House, Hill House and Golf House are all created

to act as an extension of personal homes, offering a place where our owners would want to come gather and enjoy with friends and family.”

The Great House lives up to its name, featuring a restaurant, Descend Dining Room & Bar, helmed by chef Chad Storms; well-appointed member lounges; TrackMan golf simulators; and The Parlor, with an ice cream bar, a two-lane bowling alley, a gaming and media room, retro arcade games and a vintage pinball machine. Glass, steel and wood accent the new 14,000-square-foot gathering space, giving it a “subtle and sophisticated modern mountain feel with a nice blend of rustic interior finishes,” Jeffries adds. “All of the interior spaces also have an exterior terrace or patio that allow The Great House to live with this great blend of interior and outdoor spaces.” With the opportunity to live a life full of thrilling outdoor adventures and relaxed social gatherings alike, Tumble Creek homeowners get a taste of both sides of luxury. ■
