Autumn Serenade

Make leaf-peeping an at-home pursuit at these properties out West



It may not feel like it, but fall is just around the corner—the autumnal equinox is September 23—which means leaf-peepers will soon be venturing out to watch green give way to yellow, orange, and red. Rather than booking a vacation property, why not invest in a home where you can do the peeping from your bedroom window every year?

The Northeast may get all the fall glory, but the West puts on a strong show too. At **Martis Camp**, a private resort community on the California side of Lake Tahoe, aspens and maples stand bright among the firs. Enjoy the splendor while playing 18 holes at the Tom Fazio–designed golf course (it stays open until mid-October) or while mountain biking the property's 26 miles of trails. Currently on the market for a cool \$14.995 million is the striking



modular-designed, seven-bedroom home at 9525 Wawona Court.

Juniper Preserve in Bend, Oregon, is surrounded by 20,000 acres of federally preserved land and offers prime views of the Cascade Range, where the foliage peaks in mid-October. Cozy up at 22887 Ghost Tree Lane (\$1.95 million), which has three bedrooms, a guest casita, and even a secret door leading to a wine cellar. Pour yourself an Oregon pinot noir and take in similar-colored leaves from the covered patio.

Across the Idaho border, in McCall, the private residential community **Whitetail Club** offers phenomenal four-season living. Before the snow falls, autumn is great for trout-fishing in Payette Lake and hiking through the aspen groves in the Salmon River Mountains. Home sites start at just \$415,000, giving you the perfect excuse to design your own autumnal escape.

New York City's Selene

Prefer skyscrapers to trees? This condo at the Selene, a sleek Midtown Manhattan tower designed by Pritzker Architecture Prize winner Norman Foster's firm, Foster + Partners, promises prime views of the City That Never Sleeps through undulating floor-to-ceiling windows. (The unit is part of the building's "sky collection.")
