
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Nothing is lost in translation at the revamped Park Hyatt Tokyo

For many, the Park Hyatt Tokyo will be forever remembered as the setting for Sofia Coppola's seminal 2003 movie Lost in Translation. As the hotel readies for its reopening following an extensive transformation by Jouin Manku, the film's fans may be delighted to know that its restaurant, the New York Grill, where Scarlett Johansson and Bill Murray drift into a tender, transient friendship, remains untouched, still clad in John

Morford's ebony-and-walnut palette and adorned with Valerio Adami's murals of New York landmarks. Check into room 4706, where some of the film was shot, then seek out the bowls used for nuts in the bar scene. Made by Japanese brand Toyo-Sasaki, they were discontinued a decade ago but are still produced exclusively for the hotel. For a Suntory moment, order a Hibiki 17-year-old whisky on the rocks. hyatt.com

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
